- Long success history of partnership with EU universities (since 1994) and considerable impact on HE
- Committed and highly motivated partners, enhanced project management capacity
- Local ownership is enhancing thanks to direct link to on-going reform and programme impact
- Considerably improved foreign language and IT skills





Tempus/Erasmus+ Erasmus + impact in Uzbekistan

- Professional development of academic and administrative staff, non-academic partners
- Contribution to introduction 2-tier HE system since **1997: in particular to development of new Master** programmes; on-going support to development of doctoral level
- Enhancement of university- enterprise cooperation, university governance and management
- **Improvement of resources and technical facilities**
- Overall support to implementation of national strategy on HE development

HIGHER EDUCATION OF UZBEKISTAN: FUNDAMENTAL TRANSFORMATIONS SINCE 2011 (1)

- cardinal improvement of the quality of training of highly qualified specialists
- reconsidering education areas and specialties according to labour market needs (increased quotas for engineering fields)
- Substantial budgets to qualitative improvement of continuous professional development of HEIs` staff

Current developments in the field of higher education in Uzbekistan

-Updating, reforming and aligning core curricula of mandatory (core) and elective courses/course modules in BSc and MSc degree programs

-Enhancing innovative skills of graduates via various academic and research activities and projects;

-Opening up for broader collaborations with Western universities in academic and research exchanges

- Improvement of university governance, modernization of HRM in higher education system, including recruiting and career development





Current challenges in the field of higher education in in Uzbekistan

-To attract and recruit talented graduates to work in universities and pursue an academic career as a researcher and teacher;

-To enhance quality of research projects carried out in universities;

-To enable, motivate and teach academics (how to) to publish in respected journals with higher impact factors;

-To upgrade laboratory facilities and resources of the universities

-To introduce modern textbooks and training materials, advanced teaching methodology and ICT










