


# Secondary School Leaving Certificates

Under Hungarian law no need for recognition


- European Union countries and so called Lisbon Recognition countries
- Under bilateral recognition arrangements
- International Baccalaureate Diploma (but not a certificate or course results) or
- European Baccalaureate Certificate

# What is considered a foreign secondary school leaving certificate in Hungary?

Successful completion of a foreign secondary school

**AND** 

 Gives access to higher education in the country of origin



# What is considered a foreign secondary school leaving certificate in Hungary?

- Successful completion = 12 (or 11) years of school (primary and secondary) education
- Gives full access to university (no de facto admittance is needed)
- No significant difference is established

# Academic recognition of foreignes diplomas

- For Hungarian master courses
- For Hungarian doctoral courses
- For so called postgraduate specialist training



# For a Hungarian Master course

A foreign qualification may be recognised as a Hungarian Bachelor degree, if it is

- issued by a foreign higher education institution
- after a higher education course
- of at least three years of nominal duration and
- academically comparable to a Hungarian bachelor degree (e.g. gives access to Master study in the country of origin)



## For a Hungarian PhD course



A foreign qualification may be recognised as a Hungarian Master degree, if it is

- issued by a foreign higher education institution
- after a higher education course
- of at least one year of nominal duration and
- the entrance requirement is a foreign Bachelor





- Who is responsible for academic recognition: Hungarian higher education institutions
- To be submitted:
  - Certified copy of the diploma or the secondary school leaving certificate
  - Certified copy of the transcript
  - Translations (certified or not, depending on the language)





- Authenticity
- The Hague Apostille
- Ranking the applicants





# Recognition of periods of study

Done by universities

Based on a so called **European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System**(ECTS)

1 ECTS credit = typically 25-30 hours of student work

1 semester = 60 ECTS credit

2 ECTS credit = (roughly) 1 US credit

### Four freedoms based on the EC Treaty:

- free movement of people
- free movement of goods
- free movement of services
- free movement of capital

### Two possible approaches:

- Harmonization (training, scope of activity), (law)
- Recognition (trust)



Individuals: right to live, work, study in another EU country

Consumers: wider choice

**Business**: much easier to do business in another EU country





3 regimes of recognition:

- 1. Automatic recognition based on professional experience (mainly crafts, industry and commerce)
- 2. Automatic recognition based on harmonised minimum training requirements (7 "sectoral professions": doctors, nurses, dentists, veterinary surgeons, pharmacists, midwives, architects)
- 3. **General system of mutual recognition** (primary or subsidiary application)



### Sectoral directives



- 1975 Doctors
- 1977 Nurses
- 1978 Dentists
- 1978 Veterinary surgeons
- 1980 Midwives
- 1985 Pharmacists
- 1985 Architects
- Xxxx Common platforms



# A different approach: general directives

- Diploma recognition without harmonization of study programmes (teachers, lawyers)
- –Case-by-case evaluation of qualifications
- -based on mutual trust





### General directives

- Additional requirements may be imposed
- Substantial differences
- Compensation measures:

Professional experience

Adaptation period

Aptitude test





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## Third country diplomas

- Directive only applies to EU citizens
- Specific rules on third country qualifications (recognition and 3 years professional experience)
- Extension to third country nationals by other Directives (Blue Card, longterm residents, family members of EU citizens)





## Third country diplomas

- Qualifications issued by a third country shall be regarded as qualifications obtained in an EU Member State if:
- the holder has three years' professional experience in the profession concerned on the territory of the Member State which recognised the foreing (third country) evidence of formal qualifications and
- it is certified by the Member State concerned




