



Accreditation of ALL credits is compulsary

Rules

- Min. 20 credits are required
- At sending university is no required subject during the mobility
- Without payment (in case of overfulfilments)

- Grades are important
- Credits are accredited based on the study programs at OU (original or brought ones)
- All subjects will be in the Diploma supplement




To transparent the details of a calculation of credits

5	Excellent – outstanding performance with only minor errors	Α
4	Good – generally sounds work with a number of notable errors	С
3	Satisfactory – fair but with significants shortcomings	D
2	Sufficent – performance meets the minimum criteria	E
1	Fail – considerable further work is required	F, Fx
